## SKATING

**U. S. Championships.**  
The amateur skating championship of the United States will be determined at tournaments in Cleveland, on January 29 and 30 and at Saranac Lake, N. Y., on February 2, 3, and 4. It is announced by President A. L. Blanchard, of the International Skating Union of America. The title will go to the skater making the greatest number of points in the various races scheduled, 30 points being credited for a victory, 20 for taking second and 10 for winning third.

## THE AUTO

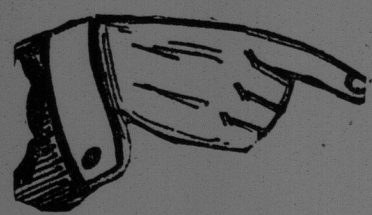
**Wins San Diego Race.**
