RING. Ahearn Defeats Gans.

Young Ahearn, holder of the English middleweight championship, defeated Italian Joe Gans of Brooklyn in a ten-round bout in Brooklyn on Saturday night. Ahearn was the aggressor throughout. The bell saved Gans in the seventh round.

Y., the other afternoon.

ROLLER SKATING. New World's Record. Roland Cloni and Edginton won the twenty-four hour roller skating race ended on Saturday at the Madison Square Garden, New York. The winners traveled 804 miles and 5 laps, establishing a new world's record. The former mark was 294 miles, hung up last year.

BASEBALL. Is Joe Wood a Has Been? "Jim" Murnane, a veteran baseball expert of the Boston Globe, predicts that Joe Wood will be of very little use to the Red Sox this year. Writing from the Hot Springs, Murnane says: "To me Joe Wood looked weaker yesterday than the first day that he was out for practice, so far as pitching the ball goes. From a careful study am inclined to think that Wood will be of little value to the Red Sox this season; yet, I may be mistaken, for the warm weather may thaw out a once great salary wing.

"There is no smoke in the wake of the ball that Sir Joseph tosses up to the batter this spring. He is a grand ball player, apart from his pitching, but in all positions the salary wing has a big function to perform, and without his good right arm in shape little can be done for the benefit of the club that is paying a heavy salary for first-class work.

"Wood is no shirler, and will get there if he can; and we all hope that some magic charm will bring around that arm that moved the greatest batters down like a giant sledge, ripping through a field of ripe wheat."

Seaton's "Licorice Ball." The latest winter league freak is the "licorice ball" of the Brooklyn Feds. It is supposed to be the inventor. The first essential in the use of the "licorice ball" is to have a piece of hard licorice in the jaw.

The pitcher must apply black saliva to one side of the ball, being the right side clean. He must throw it in such a way that the black revolves around the white and gives the batter's eye alternate flashes of light and dark that will cause him to blink and fail to get an accurate gaze on where it is coming.

Clubs to Travel \$3,593 Miles. The National League schedule for the coming season requires the eight clubs to travel 88,898 miles. The western clubs will cover more mileage than the eastern teams. Pittsburgh leads with 12,595 miles and the New York Giants have the least traveling to do, their total for the season being put at \$,626. Figuring on teams of twenty-one players and four others, including managers, trainers, boxers, terry, this gives a total of 2,089,825 for the 200 players and others in the league.

At two cents a mile, the minimum rail-road mileage charge, the sum to be expended by the clubs between April 14 and October 7 will amount to \$41,796.80. Meals and sleeping berths will add many thousands to these figures.


