

St. Johns, Nfld., Sept. 16 .-Today Leonard Reid, son of the late Sir W. D. Reid, President of the Reid - Newfoundland Co., stands charged with murder as a result of a motor accident on the Topsail road, early this morning, when six persons were instantly killed.

The victims are Lieut.-Commander J. D. O'Callaghan, H.M. S Constance; Lieut. Burroughs, H. M. S. Constance; Geo. Harrison, of Chatham, N. B., of the staff of the Bank of Montreal; Capt. G. J. Whitty, secretary of the G. W. V. A.; Lieut. W. King, late of Royal Air Service, and Clinton Duder, son of the late W. H. Duder.

Reid, with a party of eight, was returning to the city at midnight after a supper which had been held at Topsail, near the scene of the accident. A number of people had been giving Rev. Col. Nangle a farewell party. They were about to board a bus when, with little warning, Reid's car was among them. King and Whitty were killed instantly by the impact.
