

Rest-Rooms for Women Conductors on Toronto Street Railway; Men Believe Work Will Prove

Toronto, May 24—The Toronto Street Railway Company is making preparations for the employment of women motormen and conductors. Comfortable rest rooms for their use are being outfitted in the barus, partitioned off from the general waiting room. The uniforms have not yet been placed on order, and the women will not be employed until arrangements are completed. Working hours, pay, etc., will be definitely scheduled, but it is expected that they will receive the same pay as the men for equal work.
