The available returns refer to the live tock owned by 5,874 farmers on April 1st, 1911. At that date their farms sup-ported 5,187 horses, 22,079 head of horned cattle, **33**,626 pigs, 1,156 sheep and 155,250 fowls. These figures represent an average per farm of 1 horse, 4.1 head of horned cattle, 6. pigs, 0.2 sheep and 29 fowls. Comparing these figures with those of the previous statistical return
