Line Will Be Extended to Pacific and Steamer Lines Will Connect Eastern Terminus With Europe—Another Hudson's Bay Line Also Planned



ROUNDED UP ROSENTHAL'S MURDERERS Expect to Have Whole Gang of Gun Carriers in Ten Days

ONE SURRENDERS A Dapper Little Chap—Police Seeking Real Conspirators—Commissioner Can Guess Their Identity—Private Funds For Police Investigation

New York, July 23—The gunmen wanted for the killing of gambler Herman Rosenthal are beginning to fall into the net. Harry Vallon, gun carrier and gambler, one of the five notorious gangsters who were in the "Murder Case," the night Rosenthal was shot, surrendered himself to the police this morning and within ten days Deputy Police Commissioner Dougherty expects to round up the whole gang of gun carriers.

ANOTHER CASE OF BUBONIC PLAGUE AT HAVANA Thousands of Rats Examined—Cleaning and Fumigation Continues

Havana, Jan. 23—Another case of Bubonic Plague was diagnosed here yesterday, making the third case since July 3rd. The patient had been under observation for several days at the hospital to which he had been taken from a house at Number 2 Havana street, in the district where the first case was discovered.

TO REPEAL THE OFFER Taft Would Take Reciprocity Off Statute Book FINDS IT DANGEROUS

(Canadian Press) Washington, July 23—President Taft has indicated to Republican leaders in the senate a wish to know their views about repealing the Canadian reciprocity act. The senate has already passed repeal provisions unanimously. The bill and a separate bill for the repeal of the act has been favorably reported by the finance committee. Mr. Taft so far has not indicated either to the finance committee or to senators that he absolutely favors a repeal, but he has indicated that if Senate leaders favored such a measure he would be glad to discuss it with them.

CONSOLS SINK AGAIN London, July 23—Consols sank this morning to the low figure of 78 3/4 on the stock exchange. The increased expenditure forecast in the speech on the supplementary application for the British navy made by Winston Spencer Churchill, first lord of the admiralty yesterday in the house of commons was the immediate cause of the fall, but consols at present have very few friends, and any attempt to put on the market even a small block is the signal for a decline in the price.
