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
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

Liberal Opposition Feels it is no Time to Burden **Country Further** 

Ottawa, Oct. 14.-In the expectation that the Government might take advantage of its privilege of going on with the Grand Trunk legislation today there was a Liberal caucus held this morning which was but slimly attended owing to so many members not having had time to return from the week-end holiday. The policy which the opposition was to adopt towards the Grand Trunk proposal was discussed. While some of the leading members present expressed themselves as being opposed to nationalization they also pointed out that there vas at the present time a very strong sentiment in favor of it which would robably have to run its course. Disastrous as it might be, it was urged that what Canada should do would be to accept whatever responsibility had been cast upon them in regard to the Grand Trunk Pacific, even if that responsibility by right rested on the shoulders of the Grand Trunk, and leave that road to carry on as best it can for the present years at least when the committments of Canada are so heavy.

Hon. W. S. Fielding, P. D. McKenzie, Hon. W. L. Mackenzie King and Hon. Charles Murphy were appointed to draw up a resolution to be presented today in case the Government went on with the matter. Its general effect would be that while the opposition would not say we should no take the Grand Trunk over at some future time conditions at present were such as not to permit of parliament putting such an addition on the debt of the country.

The matter did not come up in the house so the resolution remained in the pocket of the leader of the opposition, but it gives an idea of the course the opposition will likely pursue.







A man goes out and buys a lease in territory in which geologists have told him he should strike oil. He needs twenty-five to fifty thousand dollars to erect a derrick and drill a well, depending on the depth to which he must dig before he strikes oil. In some sections the oil lies in shallow fields, and in other sections he must dig much deeper. Barring accidents, such as drilling a crooked hole and having a cyclone destroy the derrick, delay in getting materials because of lack of transportation, within about thirty to sixty days he knows whether he strikes oil or has a dry hole. It doesn't take much brains to drill a well right next to another well which is a producer, and strike oil, and if the company's holdings are in a producing territory where geologists state there is oil, the investor has more than an even chance to make a fortune.—From The New York Telegraph.

FACTS AND FIGURES. WHAT THE DRILLING RECORDS SHOW. When an oil man decides to change operations into a field that is new to him, the first thing he does is to study the drilling records, the averages as supplied to the new field. Records for the entire United States for the month of March, show that there were 2,584 wells drilled. Only 403 were dry. In April there were 2,000 drilled—only 467 were dry. In the Mid-Continent fields, including Kansas, Oklahoma and North Texas, show that there were 2,584 wells drilled. Only 403 were dry. In June, 1,417 were drilled with only 262 dry. In North Central Texas alone, 401 wells were drilled in the month of June. Of these 70 month of May, 1,504 wells were drilled in North Texas with only 57 dry holes. Do you call that a gamble? Yet one good oil well will pay for a dozen dry holes. What matter if you do get
