Q.124 Will you please state your No. rank, name and unit?

A.124 F.41032 Cpl. C.A.Bardell, Regimental Police Aldershot, A.14 C.I.T.C.

Q.125 Do you recognize the accused?

Q.125 Yes sir.

Q.126 What is his name and rank?

A.126 His name is Lilley and I think his rank is Rfm. Lilley.

Q.127 During the time he was in the Guard Room have you any knowledge of him receiving money?

A.127 Yes sir.

Q.128 Do you know the amount?

A.128 Twenty-five dollars sir.

Q.129 Do you know where it came from?

A.129 I cannot tell you that sir.

Q.130 It came in what form?

A.130 Canadian National Telegraph cheque form.

Q.131 And was cashed by who?

A.131 By me sir.

CROSS-EXAMINED BY THE PROSECUTOR

Q.132 Did I understand you to say Corporal that the money came to the accused while he was in the Guard Room?

A.132 Yes sir.

Q.133 That would be some time after the 20th December 1943?

A.133 I cannot say definitely but it would be the latter part of December.

Q.134 Would it be after Xmas?

A.134 Well I think he received it just before Xmas.

Q.135 Would you say two or three days before Xmas?

A.135 I cannot give any definite day as to when he received the money.

Q.136 But this money came for the accused while he was in custody over this particular charge?

A.136 Well now I cannot give you any definite time as to when the accused received the Money Order or cheque.

Q.137 What I want to know Corporal is whether this twenty-five dollars that came for the accused arrived while he was in custody at the Guard Room on this charge that we are trying today?

A.137 Well now I cannot say the date.
