JUNE 22, 1882 A Horrible Scene. HOW THE BODIES OF THE MURDERED LORD CAVENDISH AND MR. BURKE APPEAR-ED WHEN BROUGHT HOME.

The London Times describes the scene in the Chief Secretary's Lodge, where they were laid out on separate tables in the drawing-room for the post-mortem examination.
