Some New Voices to be Heard in this Year's Grand Operatic Festival—Gertrude Hutcheson, Prima Donna Soprano—Marie di Gabbi and Mlle Gauthier to Return—Sacchetti, the New Tenor.

No greater pleasure will be assured the music lovers and theatre goers of St. John than the announcement that the noted stars of the Boston Opera Co. will pay a second visit to the Opera House for a three days engagement, Sept. 18-19-20.

This season's patrons will, perhaps, miss Madame Scotney, who won such a place in our memory last season, but there is a singer in her place who the management believe will prove equally acceptable. This singer is Mme. Gertrude Hutcheson, a coloratura prima donna soprano, who, this season is making her American debut, she having sung in the Royal Opera Houses of Berlin, Dresden, Darmstadt and Lucerne.

Another favorite to return is Mlle Ernestine Gauthier, the dainty little French contralto, who was one of the stars of bringing new opera and new stars each year, the repertoire this year consists of elaborate presentations of specially adapted forms of complete operas, "Cavalleria Rusticana," "I Pagliacci," "La Traviata" and "Don Pasquale."

The concert program preceding the operas will, of necessity, be much shorter this year, but will include many of the big numbers. John Hayes Overcome by Gas after Explosion of Dynamite—Frederickton Man Seeks Divorce.

Richibucto, N. B., Sept. 2.—John Hayes, a respected farmer of South Branch, Kent county, met death yesterday afternoon under peculiar circumstances. He was digging a well and placed a blast of dynamite in the bottom.

After the blast had exploded, Mr. Hayes went down into the well and was, it is supposed, overcome with gas. He started to climb to the surface, but fell when half way up the ladder. When taken out it was found that life was extinct. The deceased, who was sixty-eight years old, leaves a widow and one adopted daughter.
