



The fishermen at Mace's Bay, some of whom are engaged in unloading the cargo of laths by means of dories, say that the vessel will probably go to pieces.

The Reliable had to give up on Saturday on account of the thick fog and will make another attempt tomorrow to float the Donnell when the schooner will have had a great deal of her cargo removed.
