SPECIAL FOREIGN MISSION.

(CHINA INLAND.)

The total amount promised towards the support of James Lawson and James E. Duff, laboring in connection with the China Inland Mission has been \$420.15, and of this the sum of \$350.15 has been paid. Early in 1892 the sum of \$200, being the amount received up to that time, was paid over to Mr. J. W. Frost, the representative of the China Inland Mission in Toronto and since then there has been received \$150.15 including the sums of \$75 from the Christian Endeavour Society and \$24.75 from Mr. James E. Duff, of China. There is still a balance of \$70 due which it is
