My dear McLean,-

The Royal Commission will complete its final report this week. When the report is sent I take it that the Commission is dissolved automatically. We should pay Mr. White and Mr. Carmichael until they reach their respective homes. The pay of Messrs. Shaw and McDowall will cease also. Dr. McKenna will have to remain at Victoria for a while, but until we make some definite arrangement as to his future salary, he will have to go back to the old rate, namely- \$2,400.00 a year.

Very likely Mr. White will call to see you when he passes through Ottawa.

I thought I would drop you a line on this subject so that there may be no uncertainty about the financial arrangements.

I am going to Prince Rupert by the night boat, and expect to get home the last week in July.
