An Act to alter the Law of Usury.

THEREAS it is expedient to abolish all prohibitions Preamble. and penalties on the lending of money at any rate of interest whatsoever, and to enforce to a certain extent. and no further, all contracts to pay interest on money 5 lent, and to amend and simplify the laws relating to the loan of money at interest:—Be it therefore enacted, &c.

And it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, Repeal of Sect. that the fifth section of the Ordinance made and passed 5 of Ord: I. C. by the Governor and Legislative Council of the Province

10 of Quebec, in the seventeenth year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled, "An " Ordinance for ascertaining damages on protested Bills " of Exchange, and fixing the rate of interest in the Pro"vince of Quebec;" and the sixth section of the Act of And of Sect. 6.

15 the Parliament of the Province of Upper Canada, passed 51 G. III. c. 2. in the fifty-first year of His said late Majesty's Reign, intitutled, "An Act to repeal an Ordinance of the Province " of Quebec, passed in the seventeenth year of His Majesty's " Reign, intituled, 'An Ordinance for ascertaining damages

20 " on protested Bills of Exchange, and fixing the rate of "' interest in the Province of Quebec;' also to ascertain " damages on protested Bills of Exchange, and fixing the "rate of interest in this Province;" be and the same are hereby repealed.

II. And be it enacted, That no contract to be here- No Contract 25 after made in any part of this Province for the loan or for any rate of Interest to forbearance of money or money's worth, at any rate of subject any interest whatsoever, and no payment in pursuance of such party to contract, shall make any party to such contract or pay-30 ment liable to any loss, forfeiture, penalty or proceedings, civil or criminal, for usury; any law or statute to the contrary notwithstanding.

III. Provided always nevertheless, and be it enacted, Contract to be That every such contract and every security for the exces of inter-35 same, shall be void so far and so far only, as relates to estoversix per any excess of interest thereby made payable above the cent per anrate of six pounds for the forbearance of one hundred pounds for a year; and the said rate of interest shall be allowed and recovered in all cases where it is the agree-40 ment of the parties that interest shall be paid.
