

- XLIV. And be it enacted, That no Justice of the Peace, acting in obedience to, or under the authority of this Act, shall be entitled to any fee or emolument in any case or under any pretext whatsoever; Provided always, that the following fees may be allowed and paid to such Clerk as he shall have been under the necessity of employing to assist him in the performance of the duties with which he is charged by this Act; and that such Clerk or other person shall not be entitled to more than *one shilling* currency for every copy thereof, nor to more than *one shilling* currency for any subpoena, and *sixpence* currency for every copy thereof, nor to more than *one shilling and threepence* currency for enregistering any conviction, and shall be paid for drawing up any order in pursuance of such conviction, and for every other paper writing made with relation to any prosecution instituted under this Act, at the rate of *six pence* currency for every hundred words and no more, which said fees, as well as allowances made to the witnesses, shall be taxed by the Justice of the Peace before whom such prosecution shall have taken place, and the taxed account of such costs and allowance shall be annexed to the judgment and make part thereof, and no Bailiff, Constable or Peace Officer employed in the execution of anything to be done in conformity to this Act, shall be entitled to more than *one shilling* currency for every league he shall be obliged to travel in the performance of such duty, the distance travelled in returning not being reckoned nor to more than *one shilling* currency, for the service of any summons or subpoena, nor to more than *seven shillings and sixpence* currency for making a seizure under the authority of any order, or for levying any penalty under the authority of this Act: Provided always, that no Bailiff, Constable or Officer of the Peace, by whom several summonses or subpoenas shall be served in one day at the requisition of the
