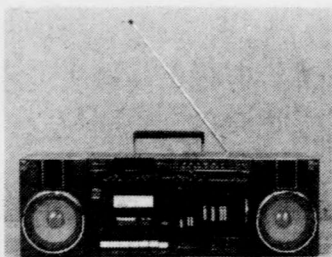

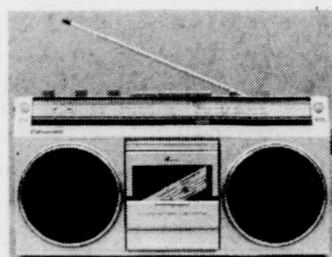

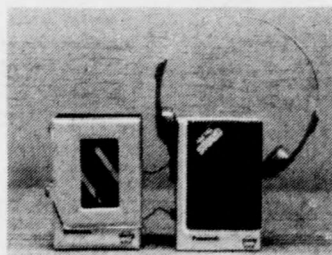

AHMED SEKOU TOURE

Sekou Toure was an outstanding Pan-Africanist. He led Guinea in 1958 to vote for total independence from France, when other 'Francophone' states in Africa chose to confederate with the colonial power. Guinea, with Sekou Toure as leader, created an independent African Monetary System in 1960. Following the right-wing military takeover in Ghana in 1966, the Guinean government and people with Sekou Toure as leader, invited Nkrumah to Guinea and made him a co-president, to emphasize their commitment and support for the progressive forces in African and world affairs.

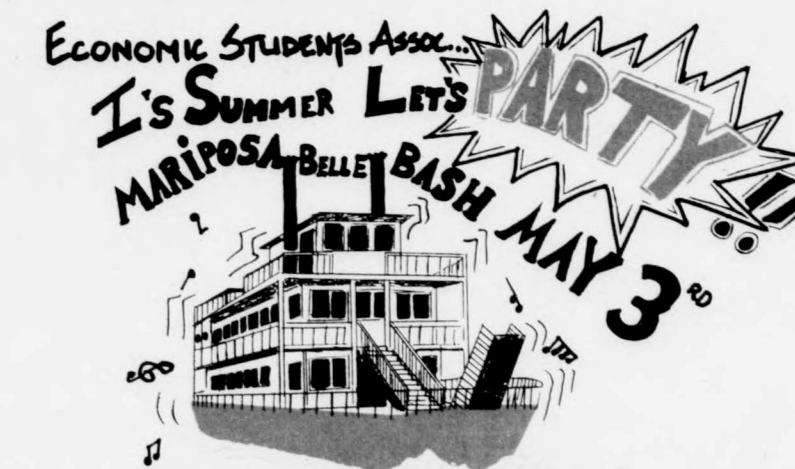
