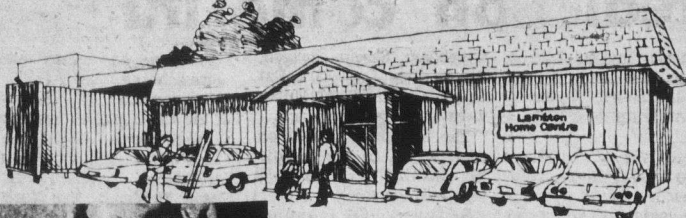

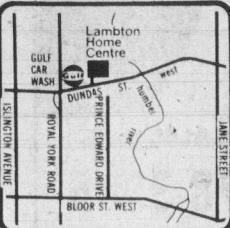

Mississauga's victory over Hillsburgh enabled Streetsville to maintain a share of top spot with 12 points.

## Dittfach goes out fast beats Hawley to wire

Jockey Hugo Dittfach, of Mississauga, won the Bristol Place First Anniversary Purse by a Hop in the slop last Wednesday.

The margin of victory was actually one and half lengths for Dittfach aboard Right Hop in the mile and 70 yard race for three-year-old fillies.

Although the track was listed as sloppy, swimmers stood a better chance than even the best mudders, as

heavy rains deluged an already slippery track.

The fifth was scheduled to be run at one mile over the Marshall turf, but was run on the dirt like all scheduled turf races that day.

A contingent of socialites, members of the press and Bristol Place hotel personnel watched the race — commemorating the first anniversary of the hotel's operation — from the Turf club following an elaborate

luncheon at Dr. Livingstone's.

Favourite Amaranth Street, with super Sandy Hawley at the reins trailed Right Hop and Virginia Maria until the final stretch run.

Hawley urged Amaranth Street past Virginia Maria on the rail but couldn't get by Right Hop before the wire.

Not only did Dittfach pick up part of the \$4,300 purse, but he came out of the race looking the cleanest of the jockeys, keeping Right Hop ahead of the pack and flying mud for the full mile and 70 yards.

The dark bay or brown filly by Right Combination out of Canalu took home a warming blanket from the Bristol Place hotel. A plaque inscribing the winner's name will remain in the hotel lobby.

"We hope to make this a yearly event if it works out well," said Ann McRobert, Bristol Place information officer.

Even though the weather was extremely uncooperative, the hotel's "Down the Stretch" cocktail was designed to take off some of the chill and the general consensus was that the tight race added a special significance to the hotel's anniversary celebrations.

## Champ Nats upset

The Erindale Nationals were eliminated from the Provincial Ball Hockey Association play-offs Monday when they lost to Scarboro T-nucks 13-4.

The win gave the T-nucks a decisive 2-1 win in the best-of-three semi-final play-off round. Earlier, Erindale defeated Scarboro 5-2 in the first game, but the T-nucks came back to tie the series with a 6-3 victory.

Erindale held a one-goal lead at one point early in the game, and by the third quarter trailed 5-4. However, the Nats defense was unable to contain the constant Scarboro attack, and the easterners went on to score eight unanswered goals.

Scoring for the Nationals were Terry Paul, Marc Neeb, Paul Blum, and Shawn Kenny. Goaltender Doug Lloyd faced 48 shots in the Erindale cage.

"We were just beaten by a better team tonight," Lloyd said after the game. "I couldn't see that they had any weak spots out there at all in this game." The T-nucks will now meet Don Mills in the P.B.H.A. championship game Thursday night.

Thus ended the remarkable season of the Erindale Nationals, the team that came from a last-place finish in 1973 to become the 1974 Western Division Champions.

Erindale finished with a 16-5-3 record, the best in the P.B.H.A., and ended with an 11-point bulge over second place Fairhome.

Two Nationals

goalscorers, Paul Blum and Terry Paul, finished among the league's top five scorers. Both have a good chance on landing spots on the All-Star team.

The Erindale offense was boosted all season by the excellent face-off work of Marc Neeb, the persistent fore-checking of Jim Adair, and the aggressive play of league-leading penalty-getter Pat Scott.

Doug Lloyd had the second-best goals-against average in the league, and should be another shoo-in for the All-Star team. Erindale's defense was hurt badly by the loss of playing-coach Sheldon Kenny.

Kenny was suspended for pushing a referee and missed the last few league games and all the play-offs. Sheldon's brother Shawn Kenny was also hampered at the end of the season by a knee injury suffered in a game against Northern. While healthy, Shawn was the best penalty killer on the Erindale squad.

Team captain Kim Paul was solid on the Erindale defense all season, and was probably the most improved player on the team. Rookie Rob teBoekhorst played half the season on defense and half as a forward, and he adjusted well to both positions.

John Klinck and J.B. Allen saw limited action over the season, but performed well when called upon.

The Nationals are already looking forward to next season eagerly.

## Goalies battle

The battle of the undefeated in the Airport Soccer League provided spectators with quite a display of individual brilliance.

Goalenders stole the show with Malton's Mike Garvey particularly devastating between the pipes.

Arrie Mourman was awarded two penalty shots and made good on both attempts for the victors.

G. Coutie answered for British Airways. In the only other league game, Cambridge trounced Accurate Mold 9-1.

In the first round of the Emery Cup, CP Air and Rothmans battled to a 2-2 stalemate in overtime.

T. Watt booted both CP Air tallies while J. Darwin and J. Swan retaliated for Rothmans.
