Board Of Education Will Go To Court Over \$9,000 Suit

COOKSVILLE — The Toronto Township board of education is being sued for \$9,000.
Last fall, the board had a contract with the Streetsville Coach Line Division of Galloway Bus Lines using 49 buses to transport children to and from school.
But in September the drivers refused to go to work and the board was forced to rent buses from the TTC and Gray Coach.
The drivers informed the board on a school morning that they were not driving starting that day. With literally no notice, the board

was not able to replace the buses in time.
They rented 28 buses at a cost of \$7,000 but lost considerable money in grants in not being able to transport all the children.
But Galloway Bus Lines because of their three-day strike, still claimed the board of education had to pay the required \$9,000.
The matter has been referred to the board's solicitor and will go to the Supreme Court of Ontario.
