With respect to Mr. Donut's suggestion
that the Chiefs, and the Miller, should meet him at my
Office, for the purpose of signing the document, and having it
explained to them, I beg to observe, that it would, in my
opinion, be more proper that he should meet them in
Council at Caughnawaga for that purpose, and one, or
more of the Officers of the Indian Department, could be
directed to attend, with him, at any time he might choose

futurely -

to appoint. If this Plan had been pursued from the beginning
and Mr. Donut had appeared more frequently among the
Indians, instead of always requiring them to come to him,
it would have been productive of more satisfaction to all
Parties concerned.

It is the wish of Mr. Donut, that the
Red Rock, and Plan, should be returned to my Office after
they have been inspected by His Lordship.
