Agreement provides for consent of Indians to reduction of a reserve. Commission considers it necessary that authority should be given under Indian Act for the taking of such consent or any release or surrender which the Indians might be ready to make at the time commission holds investigation regarding a reserve. Delay in securing consent might prejudice final adjustment.
