GENERAL REGULATIONS.

A Letter with one enclosure is double; and with two or more, if it does not weigh an ounce, is treble. Letters weighing an ounce are chargeable with four single rates; and for each quarter of an ounce above that weight, a single rate is charged.

Letters mailed for the United States must be paid to the lines, and those intended for Europe *via* New York or Boston, must be paid to those places respectively.

The postage on letters intended for England to go by the Halifax Steamers, can be paid or not, at the option of the sender; due notice is always given at the Post Office, and in the public papers, of the time of closing the mail by these steamers. The mail for them that goes by way of Boston (and on which the postage to Boston must be paid,) is in general made up about a week after that which goes by Halifax.
