BUSINESS CLASS.

Commercial Diplomas shall be given to those who pass a satisfactory examination in the following branches:

Elementary Algebra, Commission and Brokerage, Percentage, Interest, Annuities, Commercial Papers, Stocks and Bonds, Insurance, Profit and Loss, Insolvency, Exchange, Taxes and Duties, Ratio and Proportion, Equation of Payments, Partnership, General Average, Complete Course of Book-Keeping (Canadian Accountant), Banking from Bryant and Stratton's C. H. B. K.; Carhart's Commercial Law, Commercial Correspondence, Penmanship, English Grammar, English Composition, and a thorough Course of the French Language for French pupils.

CLASSICAL DEPARTMENT.

In order to be admitted to the Freshman Class in the Classical Department, students must bear certificates testifying that they have satisfactorily completed their course of studies in the Intermediate Department or the Ordinary Commercial Course. The Classical Course comprises five classes, namely:—Elements and Syntax, Versification, Belles-Lettres, Rhetoric and Philosophy.
