

Make of Cheese.

In spite of a common impression to the contrary, Mr. Publow reported that the make of cheese in Eastern Ontario to date has been about equal to the make last year and that before the end of the season it may show an increase of fire to 10 per cent. He had investi-gated the make in some 200 factories scattered all through Eastern Ontario and had found that while there was a slight falling off in make in a few districts these were more than off-set
