Preserving Liquid Air. With the best insulated carriers now in use it is found that a gallon of liquid air will not wholly evaporate in less than a month. In the co mercial production of liquid air by the regenera-tive system, so Mr. G. A Bobrick re-cently informed the Philosophical society of Washington, a pound of liquid air results from the consumption of each pound of coal. The cost is prohibitive for ordinary use in the produc tion of power, but where expense is not considered, Mr. Bobrick says, liquid air is an ideal source of power. With seventeen gallons of it he can drive his automobile between fifty and sixty miles. Although it will never be used for stationary engines, he thinks it may be useful for submarine and aerial navigation.
