PRESIDENT CLEVELAND'S LAST MESSAGE.

On the 3rd inst. President Cleveland sent his last message to Congress. It was a review of the national situation before the necessity for tariff reform; deplored the unsatisfactory relations existing between employers and employed, and inveighed against combines and monopolies.

His references to these questions show that Lord Selkirk was not so far astray in saying he believed the President was disposed to be friendly to our country, although for daring to intimate such a thing he was given his passport.

The revenue of Canada for the five months of the current fiscal year amounted to \$15,973,000, being an increase of \$1,000,000 over the same period last year. The expenditure for the same period was \$12,007,000, a decrease of two hundred thousand dollars compared with the same period last year.

Major Abbott, of Montreal, who has just returned from Europe, says there is a very strong feeling in England of having a continuous line from England to their possessions in the east through Canada. Indeed, he says, many people do not see the use of spending money on first-class Pacific connection unless first-class Atlantic one is made as well.

When the Senate, for political purposes, thought fit to reject this treaty, the President, influenced, no doubt, by his most radical advisers, assumed the role of the despotic politician and threatened us with immediate retaliatory measures if we did not unconditionally grant our neighbors those privileges which the same President, a few months before, declared it would be proper to secure for an ample consideration.
