It stated that Amundsen had notified his rival from Maderia of his plans. The meeting took place at Whate Bay, in the Ross Sea and was short. Scott paid a visit to Amundsen on the latter's vessel, the Fram. On the following day the call was returned aboard the Terra Nova. Scott learned that eight of the Fram's rew were establishing winter quarters two miles inland. Amundsen informed the British officer that he oped to reach the Pole by the way of the Beadmore glacier. He had 116 dogs and enough sleighs and skis to en was to have his supplies landed nd his winter quarters ready a few ays after the Terra Nova left for New Zealand. As soon as he had setled his shore camp, he intended to depatch the Fram to Buenos Ayres, while he remained with nine men to nake the dash farthest south.
