Sia Scoutplane, in Trip From Norfolk

Beats Pomilio's Record on Monday .-Welcome at Mineola-Lieut, Ballerni Thrills Spectators by Hazardous Evolutions Just Before Landing.

Special to The New York Tribune. Mineola, L. I., Oct. 23 .- A third Italan airplane, carrying a pilot and ob-

server, reached the army aviation field here to-day after flying 350 miles

from Langley Field, near Norfolk, Va., in three hours and ten minutes, a record surpassing that made by the Po-

milio scoutplane yesterday when it flew 330 miles in two hours and fiftyfive minutes. The average speed attained by the new arrival, a Sia scout,

was more than 120 miles an hour, and at times the motors drove it at about

150 miles an hour, as compared to the highest speed of about 140 miles an

hour reached by the Pomilio machine

The Sia machine is larger than the omilio scout and is built in the Fiat

factory at Turin, with motors of 300horse power. According to the Italian officers in command of the squadron

When the Sia took to the skies at

feet, until the pilot swerved so that he could almost "touch" Philadelphia. Word that the speedy plane had left Langley Field was sent to the Mineola Field, and before 12 o'clock American aviation officers had gathered with Captain Resnati and the crew of the big Caproni biplane to watch for the little Sia. She came out of the south so rapidly that no one had time to say "Here she comes," and by the time signals were set so that the pilot could see where to land she was hovering overhead at about 2,000 feet, waiting to begin a spiral descent,

The Sia landed at 12.40 o'clock. As soon the pilots had been greeted by the Italian officers of the other planes, Lieutenant Baldioli, who piloted the Pomilio from Norkfolk, yesterday went into the air to fulfill a promise to Colonel Rockwell, in command of the American aviators in training here, to show the American students what a super-pilot was expected to know before he was able to clip the edges off the mountain peaks on the Italian front in observing the American officers said that the field here had seen no such flying by any pilot before. Baldioli looped and dipped and put his plane through every manoeuvre and trick down to the exhibition fliers, and then ended by showing them the trick of "turn climbing," a spiral rarely attempted even by experienced aviators.

When he reached the field again Lieutenant Baldioli admitted he had been in more danger on this short flight than in many of his flights over the lines, because of the tricks he had attempted. The officers and students applauded him loudly when he dipped down as if firing a volley into the faces of a line of Austrians in the trenches and then soared away
