The number is accurate to 1 per ent. Some of the measurements are 0 times as accurate as this; for intance, the distance from the centre of the chlorine ion to the centre of he sodium ion is 0.00000001108 inches. To date the diameters of 25 different kinds of ions have been measured. The X-rays not only show the dimensions of these lons, but also their arrangement in space. Some crystals have all the ions apparently arranged on the corners of tiny imaginary cubes, and still others have ions at he corners of cubes and extra ions at the centres of the cubes, and still other crystals have an even more complicated structure.
