### France's Parcel **Post Service**

Mr. Chaumet, Minister of Commerce, is considering plans to improve the parcel post service in France. The system which he has under consideration is based on that in operation in Alsace and Lorraine. The main improvement which Mr. Chaumet hopes to effect, according to advices received by the Bankers Trust Company, of New York, from its French Information Service, is in expediting the despatch of parcels. The scheme pro-vides that only parcels under five kilos shail be delivered at the domicile. Parcels above that weight are to be collected by the addresses on receipt of notice from the post office. Parcels weighing up to 50 kilos would be accepted under this scheme if it goes through.


