France's Growing Motor Trade

France's export trade in motor cars during the first seven months of 1925, according to advices received by the Bankers Trust Company of New York from its French information service, shows the following figures for the different countries:

Belgium-Luxemburg 3,643 " Germany 4,317 " Spain 4,273 " Algeria 2,752 " Other countries 2,238 " totalling 33,282 units and a value of 1,079,282,000 francs as against 25,646 units and 680,430,000 francs for the same period in 1924.

Exports in heavy cars and trucks for trade and agriculture for the first seven months amounted to 2,394 units and 102,428,000 francs as against 2,518 units and 74,458,000 francs.
