spout (wet pipe). The rod in this hydrant is
actuated by a brass screw and handle above,
and raising plunger the smallest fraction of
an inch, closes waste before any water can
enter discharge pipe. With the valve open
we have the full and unobstructed flow of
water through the hydrant which can well be
compared to a straight way valve or round
way cock. Closing the valve empties all water
from wet pipe through dry hole. To repair
lyrium or washer remove top cap or plate
and withdraw plunger valve. It can be
readily repaired without digging up.
