A WEALTHY CHURCH.

Minneapolis, Oct. 16.—In the Episcopalian house of deputies Rev. H. C. Duncan, of Louisiana, reported that since the last conference in '92, ten bishops had died and fourteen had been consecrated. The church now has 79 bishops, 4,544 clergymen and 567 candidates for lay orders. It had 190,-\$20 baptisms in the past year and 131,473 confirmations. There are now 61,850 communicants, 5,117 church edifices and nearly 500 institutions of a benevolent or educational character. Contributions from all sources had reached \$38,000,000.
