RURAL DEAN GUNNE MAY COME TO LONDON

Clinton Clergyman Has Been Offered Rectorship of Christ Church.

Rev. Rural Dean C. R. Gunne, M.A., of Clinton, has been offered the rectorship of Christ Church in succession to Rev. R. S. W. Howard, who is going to Chatham.

Bishop Williams had a long conversation with Rev. Mr. Gunne over the telephone last night, and is inclined to believe that he will accept the offer. The congregation of Christ Church are in favor of Rev. Mr. Gunne as their prospective rector, and have left the matter entirely in the bishop's hands. Mr. Gunne graduated from Trinity College, Toronto, and for some years engaged in the teaching profession in the United States, at one time holding a professorship in the University of California at Berkeley. He afterwards entered the ministry, and was in charge of parishes at Millbank, Gorrie and Parkhill, before going to Clinton. His father, Rev. J. F. Gunne, is now rector at Wyoming. His sister, Miss K. Gunne, resides at 273 Oxford street, this city.

A NEW WARD OPENED AT VICTORIA HOSPITAL

Eight More Private Rooms Are Added to the Institution—Dr. Butterwick Resigns.

At a meeting of the hospital trust, held yesterday afternoon, the resignation of Dr. Butterwick, house surgeon, was received, and accepted.

Dr. Butterwick expected to receive the appointment for the first half of the year, but when he did not, he secured a position in Philadelphia. On motion of Mr. S. Scraton, Dr. McFarlane, who has been connected with the pathological department, was named for the vacancy.

A check for \$200 was received from the Medical School, to go towards the expense of renovating the students' lecture room at Victoria Hospital. Chairman Judd reported that the work, before it could be finished, would cost a trifle more than at first expected. The house committee was instructed to carry it to completion. Superintendent Heard announced that ward 15 was completed and ready for occupancy. This means eight more private rooms for the institution. He also reported that during the month of 176 patients had been received—49 males, 78 females, and 38 children—and that during the same period 177 patients had been discharged—47 males, 78 females, and 38 children. The number of patients receiving treatment in October was 111. The receipts for the month were \$2,315.10.

Those present at the meeting were: Mr. J. C. Judd, chairman; George B. Harris, S. Scraton; T. G. Turnbull, and Superintendent T. Heard.

GUNN---STEPHENSON

Former London Lady Wedded to a Vancouver Gentleman at the Coast.

Miss Annie L. Stephenson, formerly of this city, was married in Vancouver last week. Miss Stephenson is the daughter of J. L. Stephenson, who at one time conducted the Vancouver News-Advertiser. The Vancouver News-Advertiser has the following to say of the wedding:
"At St. Paul's, yesterday afternoon, the marriage was solemnized of Miss Annie L. Stephenson, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. J. T. Stephenson, to Mr. W. H. Gunn, the rector, the Rev. Mr. Chadwick, officiating. Miss Stephenson, who was unattended, was given away by her father. Her bridal gown, worn with a filmy tulle well arranged over a chaplet of orange blossom, was fashioned in princess, of ivory white moiré satin, the skirt entrained and trailing behind the bride, and being caught in front in a butterfly festoon with a knot of orange blossom, the corsage had a guimpe of fine net outlined with embroidery and the short sleeves were adorned with entwined in a faggoted design.
