Brooklyn Eagle Gets Verdict in the \$100,000 Libel Suit. New York, Jan. 28 .- A verdict for

was out 40 minutes. summing up for the defence, In Isaac Roeland insisted that the sale of "miracle" wheat as carried on in Pastor Russell's tabernacle elsewhere was a purely business scheme to benefit the Watch Tower Bible and Tract Society, which, he asserted, is dominated by the pastor.
