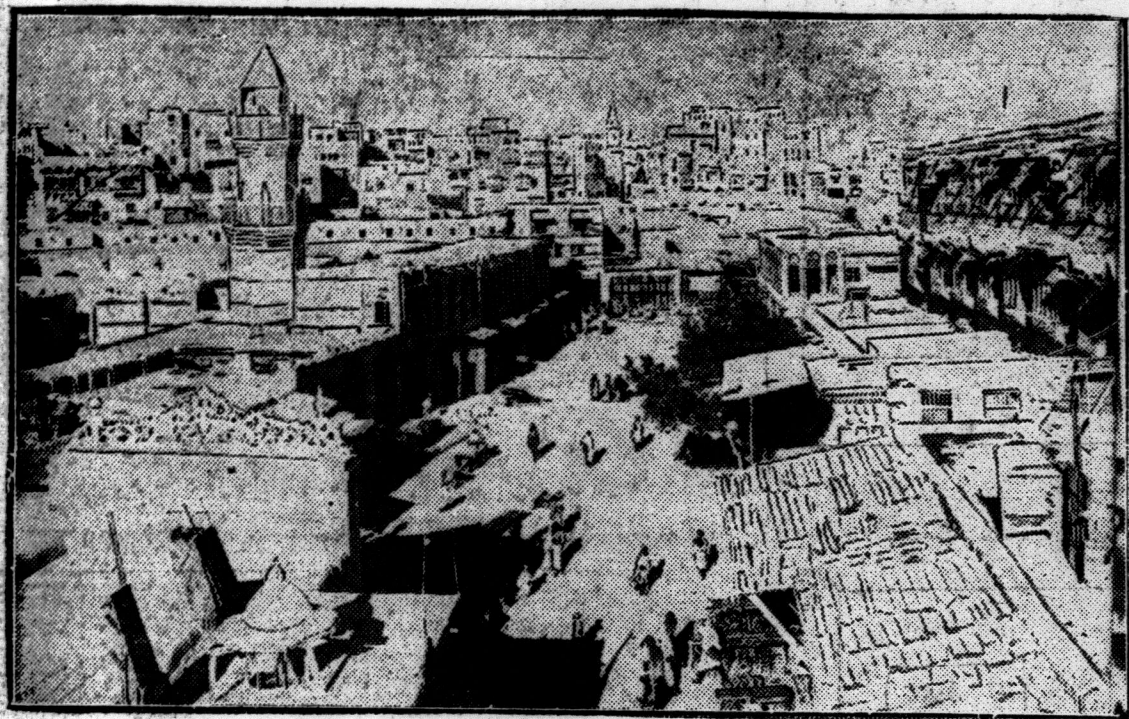

Miss Violet MacMillan, who won the prize for the smallest feet in a New York contest.



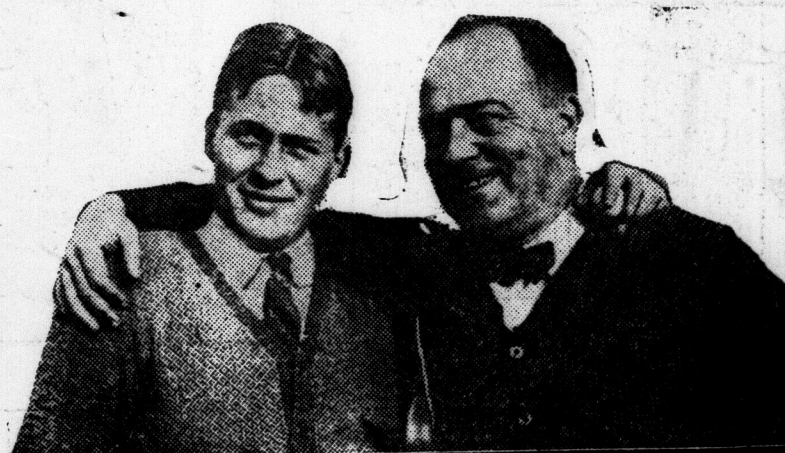
A golden eagle snapped in its native haunts.



Gen. H. T. Allen, commander of the American forces just ordered home from Germany.



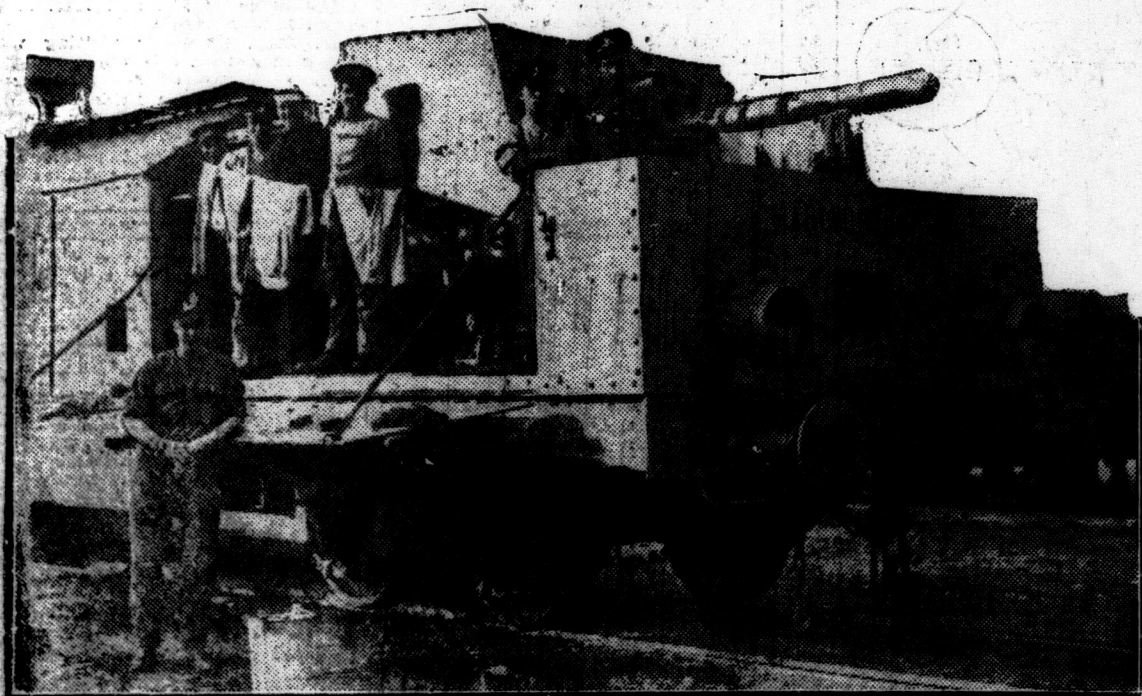
Bishop-Elect Adroit, head of the French seceding priests from the Roman Catholic Church, and his bride. The new church permits the marriage of priests.

The very latest in armored trains with the British forces in Turkey.



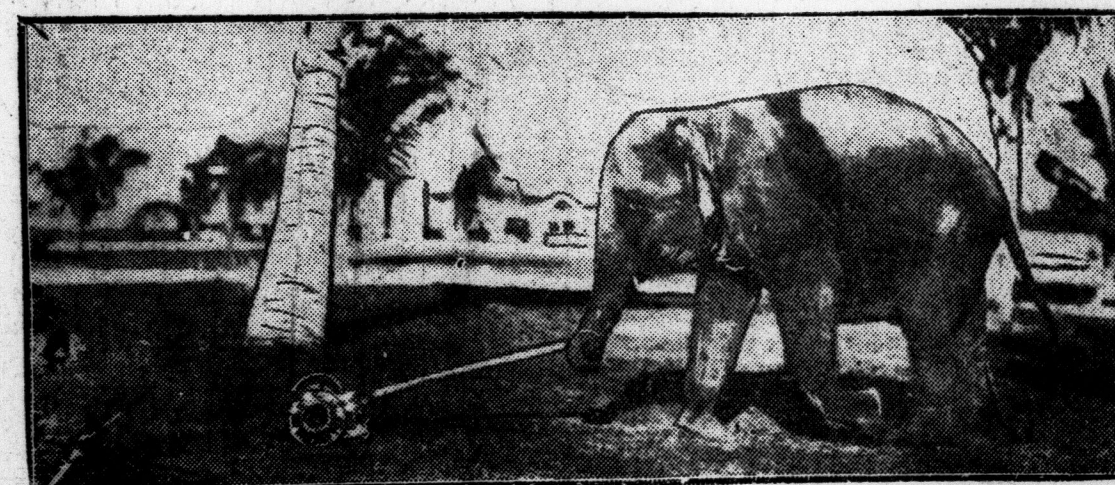
Helen McCaffery, aged 13, of San Diego, is a golf prodigy. She can go round the course in just a little over par.
