**NEW REASON FOR BRITISH
BAN ON CANADIAN CATTLE**
Premier Asquith Tells Deputation
Lapses Guarded Boundary Line
Makes American Infection
Possible

LONDON, Aug. 31.—A deputation re-
presenting various trading interests
attended parliament today to ask the
government to remove its embargo on
the importation of Canadian cattle.
Premier Asquith said he regretted
that he saw no possibility of acceding
to this request, for while it might be
true that disease was nonexistent
among cattle in Canada, it was indis-
putable that disease appeared from
time to time in the United States with
destructive results and it was impos-
sible for the purpose to put Canada
and the United States into water-tight
compartments owing to the long and
loosely guarded boundary line.
