THE RUSSIAN HOLOCAUST

ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTY PER-SONS BURNED IN A CIRCUS.

Doors That Would Not Open—A Man of Bearing Humiliated—A Poor Water Supply.

ST. PETERSBURG, Jan. 15.—The loss of life by the burning of the circus in Berlin on Saturday was not so great as reported, but it is believed that over a hundred and fifty persons perished. The fire broke out towards the end of the performance, caused by the careless handling of fireworks on the stage. The curtain became ignited and the flames quickly spread to the walls and the roof.

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
