2 25 Out of pocket ... The party who bought this stock thought he had the inside track, and had, so far as any one can have who is not a manipulator of stocks. He could not clear himself at any time. To have cleared himself when he sold he would have had to get about 1241. To have cleared himself before any interest had accumulated he would have had to have got 1202, ½ per cent advance. Had the stock advanced I per cent immediately and he sold without any advance he would and ne sold he would only have made \$5. Had he sold without any advance he would have been \$5 out of pocket. Now, stocks are just as likely to go down as go up, and when they do go up, they seldom, on the whole, go up more than ½ per cent. There is therefore about ten chances to one that a person will not be able to get out clear. person will not be able to get out clear without holding on indefinitely for a rise, and when a person has held on a short time the interest has run up so that it more than offsets any probable rise in the stocks, and when any probable rise in the stocks, and when people hold any quantity, the interest accumulates so rapidly that they have to sell unless they are well fixed or can raise the wind, which in perhaps 99 cases out of 100 only increases their ultimate loss. When people who have the handling of money get stuck, the temptation to use money not their own, in the hope of stocks advancing and it turning out all right, is too great for 99 out of 100 people to withstand. The bank man agers and other officials who have set the example in this business should, by rights, be held in this business should, by rights, be held accountable for the defalcations through stock gambling and at least made to make the amounts good. Managers and officials had better be careful about bulldozing and dismissing clerks for speculating on margin, for one manager at least can be retaliated on in a way he probably little dreams of. The sooner stockholders take up this matter and make an example or two that will have some effect, the better all round.
