Nor do the miners explain from what source they expect to draw the funds to support the 400,000 men who, they say, will go out together. The injury to commerce, industries and the community generally is very great, but the Owners' Federation is probably the strongest body ever got together to resist a strike.

The Liverpool dock strike continues, neither side showing signs of giving in. There are daily processions on the London dock strike model, and the same wild talk of blowing up the docks, which the police are protecting. The Newcastle engineers, 30,000 strong, are expected to strike to-day. The point in dispute is whether work shall cease on Saturday at 12 or 1 o'clock.
