The Private Dairy. If the making of butter is simply a matter of setting the milk, collecting the cream and using the churn, the matter would be no difficulty in making butter on every farm, but the reality is that the making of butter depends upon the temperature, manner of setting the milk, food of the cow, her health, the character of a producer, quality of milk and mode of churning.

A lower temperature than 50° is injurious to the keeping quality of the butter if it did not hurt the flavor, though some good butter makers can make some much longer. It is a mistake to think all the cream must be obtained except at low temperatures, and keeping butter the cream must be obtained by a ripening process by exposure to the oxygen of the air while it is in the can.
