

during our journey. To Lieutenant Ballantyne, late of H. M. S. *Sparrow-hawk*, and Capt. Lewis, of H. B. Co.'s steamer *Otter*, I am indebted for much valuable information regarding the harbours, and also the Indians of the British Columbian coast. Mr. Macoun, botanist, of Belleville, Ont., has also contributed very important data regarding the flora and growing capabilities of the Peace River country. In the section exhibited, from Lesser Slave Lake to the Fraser River, the reader will kindly bear in mind that absolute correctness is not to be expected. The elevations *may* be erroneous to the extent of one or two hundred feet; and I shall consider my deductions fortunate, if I am within a hundred feet of the truth. To those conversant with engineering technicalities and the fluctuations of atmospheric pressure, these remarks are of course unnecessary.
