Lord Stratlmairn, in giving evidence be-fore the Parliamentary and Municipal Elec-tions Committee on Friday last, spoke of the manner in which troops were required to protect voters in going to the poll during the Irish elections. The voters were much under the influence of the Roman Catholic clergy, and for that reason he did not think the ballott would be a sufficient protection.
