## The Rite

Of Blessing a New Church or Public Oratory, so that the Most Holy Sacrifice of the Mass may be celebrated therein.

From the Roman Ritual.

The Celebrant attired in suitable Vestments of a white colour, and preceded by the Cross in the midst of two Acolythes, bearing lighted tapers, the Clergy and his attendants, advances to the principal Gate of the Church or Oratory, where standing opposite the Church with his head uncovered, he says the following prayer,

Direct we be seech thee, O Lord, our actions by Thy inspirations, and prosper them by Thy assistance, that every prayer and work of ours, may always begin from Thee, and that what we have begun, may by Thee be ended mouth shall declare thy praise. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

He then begins the Antiphon. Asperges me Domine. Thou wilt sprinkle me, O Lord, and I shall be cleansed; Thou wilt wash me and I shall be made not despise. whiter than snow.

The Clergy then recite alternately with Sio built up. the
