

LEGISLATIVE.

The Bill to incorporate the Medical Society, was after some discussion, rejected in the Legislative Council on the 6th inst. The object of the Bill was to prevent empiricism, by more stringent regulations than at present exist...

The Bankrupt Bill introduced by Hon. Mr. McCully, has been discussed, and a motion to defer it until the 11th of 7.

On the 9th inst. a Bill was presented to the House of Assembly, to enable the City of Halifax to build a General Hospital.

On the 10th of 7, Mr. Kilham, the Hon. Financial Secretary, in reply to Mr. Kilham, who asked for some explanation about the revenue, gave reason to expect that the revenue this year would be less than for the last, owing to the reduction of duties under the Rectifying Act...

On the 20th inst. a Temperance petition signed by 400 inhabitants of Halifax, men, women and children, was presented by Mr. Wier, praying for a prohibitory enactment respecting the traffic in ardent spirits.
