THE ETHICS OF CONTRACT Practice.—We have been requested to reprint an article read by Dr. W. B. Davis, of Pueblo, Colo., before a recent meeting of the Pueblo County Medical Society, entitled "When is Contract Practice Unethical?" We do so, feeling that while in some respects the strictures of Dr. Davis' paper are inapplicable to the conditions affecting the medical profession in our maritime provinces, there is nevertheless much in the paper which does apply. It is unfortunately a fact that of recent years the multiplication of lodges of various benefit societies has led to a much greater infringement of the code of ethics than was formerly the case.
