THE London Agricultural Gazette says that Canadian butter is the worst class of butter that is brought to the English

THE hog packing business in Western cities for the past year will show a total of 11,150,000 of these creatures, which is in excess of any former year.

ONE half ounce of salt to the pound of butter is the rule for salting adopted by the makers of the celebrated "trade mark" lump butter, which sells for a fancy price in the American market.
