

## APPENDIX 12

### Procedure in the Service of Low-Power Mobile Radiotelephone Stations

(See Article 29)

I. The following procedure is given as an example <sup>(1)</sup> :—

1st A calls:

Hullo B, hullo B, A calling, A calling, radiotelegram for you, radiotelegram for you, over.

2nd B replies:

Hullo A, hullo A, B answering, B answering, send your radiotelegram, send your radiotelegram, over.

3rd A replies:

Hullo B, A answering, radiotelegram begins from  
....number....number of words....date....  
time....address....text....signature....,  
transmission of radiotelegram ends, I repeat,  
radiotelegram begins from....number....  
number of words....date..time....address  
....text....signature....radiotelegram ends,  
over.

4th B replies:

Hullo A, B answering, your radiotelegram begins,  
from....number....number of words....  
date....time....address....text....signature....,  
Your radiotelegram ends, over.

5th A replies:

Hullo B, A answering, correct, correct, switching off.

6th A then breaks off the communication and both stations resume their normal watch.

*Note:* At the beginning of a communication, the calling formula is spoken twice by both the station calling and the station called. When communication has been established, it is spoken once only.
