point for the Canadian community.



On Valentine's Day, we held a "Give from the Heart" Food Drive, and at the end of March, the third Annual Can-Assist Swim-a-thon was held. The Swim-a-thon raised

Rs. 36,000-00 under the able management of Maureen Kleniewski and her committee. This money will be disbursed to a variety of worthy causes, including the Delhi School for the Blind, the Haemophiliacs Association, Bethany Village Scholarship Fund, and a home for battered women.

Both the Canadian Club and Can-Assist have proved themselves to be interesting and viable organizations. Canadians resident in New Delhi are fortunate to have so many dedicated volunteers.
