



- 5.25 The trade component of circumpolar foreign policy should also promote the trade of northern products and expertise with the south, with the provision of appropriate controls to ensure that undue pressure is not placed on fragile resources. This must be done jointly with other Arctic nations, so as not to jeopardize limited markets. (Quebec)
- 5.26 Team Canada-type groups of business people and entrepreneurs from northern regions should travel across the circumpolar region to share information on economic development project opportunities. (Quebec)
- 5.27 Canada should promote the recognition that the Arctic is the homeland of its Indigenous Peoples and local communities, and that Arctic societies must share the benefits from the development taking place in these homelands. (Edmonton)
- 5.26 Given our expertise in remote delivery of health care, Canadian foreign policy should look at the export potential of our "distant" delivery health care systems. (Edmonton)
