Canadian small and medium-sized enterprises. The NDP opposes that policy. There is also means within the act to provide for the easier entry of banks into the banking system. Once again, the NDP opposes that policy. The NDP would like to have the government take control of the banking system and run it in a bureaucratic fashion. I suggest that is totally wrong.

In addition, the government has promised to bring forward in the fall or during the next session a new savings, trust and loans act to allow other institutions to enter the field. This will expand the activities of these institutions and bring more competition to bear on the banks, thereby providing a more competitive market.

The government has tabled amendments which go very far toward meeting all the reasonable arguments that have been put forward with regard to the Bank Act. I will be very interested in the future committee meetings to see whether in fact, considering that the government has brought forward these amendments, there will be a change of heart on the other side of the House and whether the Bank Act will be brought forward post haste and passed without further delay.

Over the past few weeks the NDP have railed time and again against chartered banks. I will not apologize for the chartered banks. I would welcome from the NDP one shred of hard, objective information which indicates that they are right. They do not have that information. They rail but they do not give the evidence. They cast innuendoes and aspersions on the chartered banking system. If what they say is true, then let us see the hard evidence and the analysis.

The NDP talks about the difference between the bank rate or the discount rate in the United States and in Canada. The fact is that in the United States right now the federal reserve discount rate is 6.5 per cent and the bank prime rate is between 12 per cent and 12.5 per cent. Canada's prime rate is 10.5 per cent and our bank prime rate is between 13.25 per cent and 13.5 per cent. The spread is much lower in Canada.
